OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS REINSTATED

Bishop David A. Zubik along with all the Catholic bishops of Pennsylvania in reinstating the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, starting August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

"The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days comes from our Baptism as Christians. Baptism compels Christians to unite themselves with Christ at the altar in his saving Sacrifice of the Cross," the Pennsylvania bishops wrote.

Bishop Zubik is encouraging parishes to continue livestreaming Mass. "Many, many shut-ins have come to appreciate such beautiful opportunities for them to be connected to the Church," he said.

As always, people who are ill, who suspect that they may have been exposed to a contagious disease, have caregiver obligations or have serious anxiety about being in a large group at this time are not required to attend Mass. People who are ill or who may carry a contagious illness are strongly encouraged to stay home.

"Those who are legitimately excused from Mass on Sundays and Holy Days are encouraged to spend time in prayer, meditating on the Death and Resurrection of the Lord, reading the Sacred Scriptures, and uniting themselves to Christ in his worship of the Father of us all. Those who are legitimately excused are also encouraged to view a broadcast of the Mass which is intended for those who cannot participate in person."

It is with joyful hearts that we welcome our children back to onsite Faith Formation this fall!

Here at St. John Neumann, three options are available as outlined below.

If you prefer a more traditional approach, like CCD, you may register for Faith Formation at Assumption in Bellevue. Please contact Mary Vic Taylor at mvtaylor@assumptionchurch.org for more information.

Option 1: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a model of faith formation for children beginning at the age of 3 years old through 6th grade based on the educational methods of Italian educator Maria Montessori. Good Shepherd sessions take place in a specially prepared environment called an atrium, where children can focus on the treasures of our faith — Scripture and liturgy. Each session includes a presentation (about the Mass, the life of Christ, a sacrament, a parable, etc.), individual work time and communal prayer. For the child, the atrium becomes a sacred space where they come to know and love Jesus in a deeply personal way. Sessions are offered at various times throughout the week.

Option 2: Family Catechesis is a model of faith formation for all ages that engages the whole family in learning about the faith. Rather than a traditional onsite or a home-school program, Family Catechesis invites families to come together for a teaching session for parents and for children one Sunday a month from 10:45am-12:15pm. Lessons and activities for the rest of the month are worked on as a family at home. Family Catechesis allows the family to grow in their love and understanding of the Catholic faith together. This is a great way to build your family around the Catholic faith! This year, the focus of the curriculum is PRAYER.

Option 3: IGNITE is faith formation for children in grades 6 through 8. During Ignite sessions, children have a lesson presented to them, study scripture, participate in small groups, prayer and engage in icebreaker games and activities. Ignite meets weekly from 5:15-6:45pm on Wednesdays.

Readings for Mass

Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The Israelites said to them, "Would that we had died at the LORD's hand in the land of Egypt, as we sat by our fleshpots and ate our fill of bread! But you had to lead us into this desert to make the whole community die of famine!" Then the LORD said to Moses. "I will now rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not. "I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them: In the evening twilight you shall eat flesh, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread, so that you may know that I, the LORD, am your God." In the evening quail came up and covered the camp. In the morning a dew lay all about the camp, and when the dew evaporated, there on the surface of the desert were fine flakes like hoarfrost on the ground. On seeing it, the Israelites asked one another, "What is this?" for they did not know what it was. But Moses told them.

LITURGY OF THE WORD FOR CHILDREN

What is LOWC? Children experience Mass and all the normal events of life consistent with their age and stage of development. Children are not simply miniature adults, nor are they blank slates on which any of us can write prescribed scripts. Each child is a unique person created in God's image, with free will and unique gifts and talents. Nature alone does not govern a child's development; their family and environment also play a significant role in it. In particular, the religious sensibilities of children are influenced and shaped by their experiences and opportunities. Liturgy of the Word with Children makes it easier for children to participate fully in the Eucharistic celebration. In the case of Masses in which adults and children participate together, children should not feel neglected because they do not understand what is happening. A Liturgy of the Word with Children, in a separate place not too far removed from the main worship space, provides for leaders to present the readings and homily for children in a way that they can relate and understand.

THE SILVER ROSE



Each year, from early March through mid-December, several Silver Roses are stewarded by Knights of Columbus councils along routes from Cana-

da to Mexico, culminating in their arrival at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. The pilgrimage commemorates the appearance and miracle provided by our Blessed Mother to St. Juan Diego in 1531. The local Bishop did not believe that Mary had appeared to him and requested that a "sign" be given so that he would believe that Mary had indeed appeared. Mary provided the miracle to Juan Diego- red roses, not native to Mexico, in mid-December. Juan Diego presented the roses to the Bishop, who then believed. One of the Silver Roses will be displayed during Adoration on Wednesday, August 11th, from 9:30am-5:00pm.


